

INTERNATIONAL CHILDREN'S GAMES

On the 10th of July 2016 Athletes will be flying out of Melbourne to represent the Berrigan Shire in New Taipei City, Taiwan at the 50th International Children's Games (ICG). The ICG are part of the Olympic movement and involves athletes aged from 12 to 15 years of age in the year of competition, and is held every year by host Cities for both Summer and Winter games. The Berrigan Shire became involved with the ICG when we were invited to Lake Macquarie for the 48th Summer Games in 2014 it was the first time in the history of the games for them to be held in the southern hemisphere and we had a team of 12 athletes competing, 8 Swimmers and 4 Athletes, 2 Coaches a Head of Delegation and a Council representative. All the athletes had a fantastic time and there were many PB's done both in the pool and on the track and a lot of pins exchanged and some foreign words learnt. After so much positive feedback from Lake Macquarie a decision was made that it could be possible to support a team every 2nd year of competition.

This year our team will comprise of 9 Swimmers, 9 Athletes and 2 Tennis players, their Coaches and the Head of Delegation who are heavily into fundraising at the moment to raise the funds for their sporting and cultural adventure.

There is a major raffle of a \$1500.00 Beta Home Living voucher kindly donated by Beta Home Living in Finley with a 2nd prize of a \$500.00 Beta Electrical voucher which will be drawn on the 20th of February at the Finley Tractor Pull.
